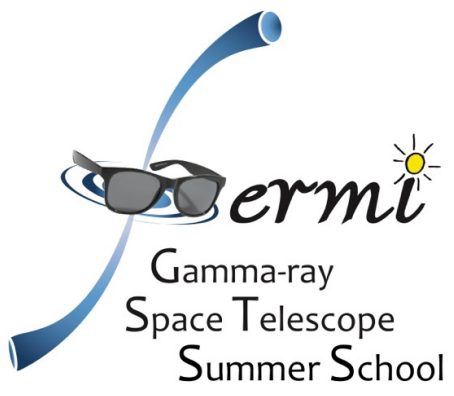

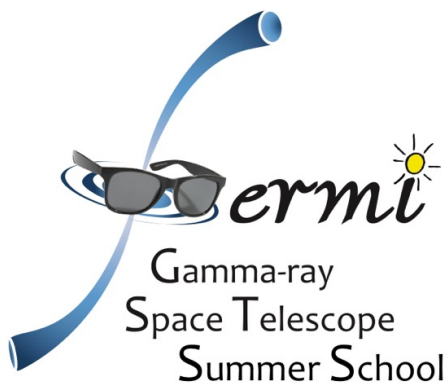

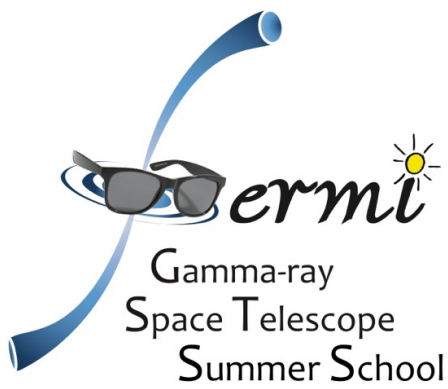
Fermi Summer School Code of Conduct

At the Fermi Summer School, we expect everyone involved to contribute to an inclusive environment that supports learning and values the differences in backgrounds and experiences that each participant brings.

It is the policy of the Fermi Summer School that all participants (students, instructors and staff) will conduct themselves in a professional manner that is welcoming to all and free from any form of discrimination, harassment, or retaliation. Participants will treat each other and local event support staff with respect and consideration to create a collegial, inclusive, and professional environment. Creating a supportive environment to enable scientific discourse is the responsibility of all participants and benefits everyone.

Participants will avoid any inappropriate actions or statements based on individual characteristics such as age, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, marital status, nationality, political affiliation, ability status, and educational background. Disruptive or harassing behavior of any kind will not be tolerated. Harassment includes but is not limited to inappropriate or intimidating behavior and language, unwelcome jokes or comments, unwanted touching or attention, offensive images, photography without permission, and stalking.

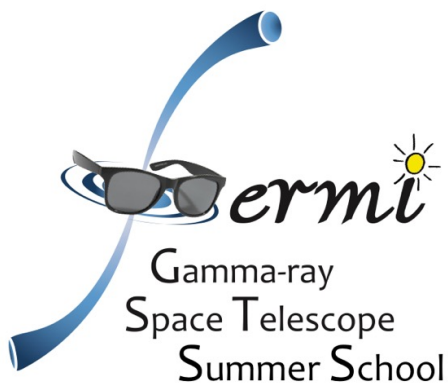
Violations of this code of conduct policy should be reported to the meeting organizers. Sanctions may range from verbal warning, to ejection from the meeting without refund, to notifying appropriate authorities. Retaliation for complaints of inappropriate conduct will not be tolerated. If a participant observes inappropriate comments or actions and personal intervention seems appropriate and safe, they should be considerate of all parties before intervening.



Fermi Summer School COVID-19 Guidelines

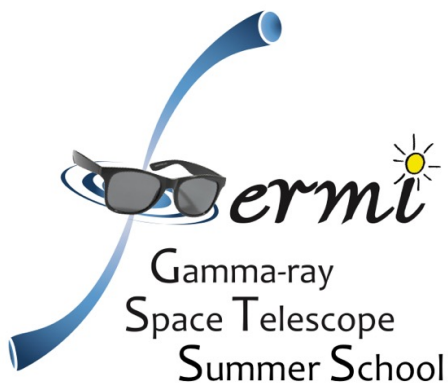
Please refer to Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (www.cdc.gov) guidelines for information about [preventing the spread of COVID-19](#) and [what to do if you are sick](#). We are counting on you to support precautions to prevent spread of disease at the Fermi Summer School.

- Positive tests: Masks are required based on CDC guidance for those who are experiencing symptoms, who have tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 5 days. We can help with masks.
- Please respect personal boundaries for social distancing and personal precautions such as mask wearing. Harassment of anyone about their choice of wearing a mask or not will not be tolerated.
- Please follow good hygiene rules -- wash hands regularly and make use of hand sanitizer, avoid sharing personal items, cough or sneeze into your elbow or a tissue, and follow other good public health practices.
