Help Desk Update: Teresa Downey

- Teresa's group has hired a consultant to facilitate help desk planning. This person will be on site May 21st thru 24th, and already has about 75 people to meet with.
- There was a survey that went out in advance to a number of people, only 10-20% responded to the survey. The consultant needs at least 200 responses to get proper data.
- There is a Help Desk Task Force in place and meetings are already happening and going well
- There is, of course, a SLAC space page
- The consultant is mainly tasked with delivering a 3 year help desk implementation plan, the firm being used is "Decision Consultants" and they are highly recommended.

News: Amber Boehnlein:

- Amedeo Perrazzo applied for a NERSC project and received an award for cycles
- There will be an upcoming HEP S&T Review, Amber would like to use the members of the SCSC for practice prior to the review.
- The GEANT 4 workshop focused on ASCR-HEP. Amber will be talking to some people about her experience there.
- LDRD Schedule: proposals have already been submitted, reviews will take place the week of May 14th, and the results will be determined by late June.

James Williams, New CIO attended and introduced himself

- From NASA Ames, a 14 year career there, with a science and engineering IT base
- His focus is customer centric: determine how to serve better as a mission support organization, how to add value to the lab overall.
- James' immediate goal is to manage expectations and to assess needs, he will be meeting with various groups for the first 6 weeks of his tenure to get an initial overview.
- He likes input, feedback and absolute candor
- Each attending member introduced themselves and gave a description of what they do, where they work in the lab, and the name of the directorate they represent
